However, for the courses to be effective I shall require

white-line on blue 35 mm slides and 2 sets of overhead trans-
parencies. Upon completion, I will return the originals plus

to you; so that I can budget for the cost of making the visuals.

I am also impressed with the practicality and simplicity of
the human factors study -- definately user friendly. I look
foward to utilizing it for some of the required field work
for our MPH candidates who plan to specialize in ergonomics
and occupational health.


